

Proposed Future Restrictions

Proposed Diversion Channel	Restrictions
Intake, Flow Control and Energy Dissipation Structure	Access to the structures is prohibited unless otherwise agreed with the Office of Public Works (OPW)
	No vegetation, material or detritus shall be disposed of within the structures, as this may increase the risk of blockage.
Bridges	Permanent access to be provided for maintenance and inspection of bridges - refer to proposed access and work area drawings AR_01, AR_02 and AR_03.
	No works shall be carried out to bridges or in close proximity to bridges without approval from the Office of Public Works (OPW).
	No vegetation, material or detritus shall be disposed of within the channel, as this may increase the risk of blockage at bridges.
Diversion Channel/ Embankments	Access to the diversion channel is prohibited unless otherwise agreed with the Office of Public Works (OPW)
	No vegetation, material or detritus shall be disposed of within the channel, as this may increase the risk of blockage at bridges.
	Diversion channel and embankments shall not be tilled or planted with any vegetation other than grass.
	Diversion channel and embankments to be regularly maintained through frequent grass cutting (approximately four times per year).
	Non-authorized vehicular or pedestrian access on diversion channel and embankments shall not be permitted.
	Diversion channel and embankments shall not be grazed by livestock other than sheep due to the potential risk of rutting or causing damage to the embankments.
	No works shall be permitted in close proximity to diversion channel and embankments without approval from the Office of Public Works (OPW).
Washlands	No works shall be carried out to the washlands or in close proximity to the washlands without approval from the Office of Public Works (OPW).
	No vegetation, material or detritus shall be disposed of within the washlands, as this may reduce the capacity of the channel.
Regraded Ground	No works shall be carried out to regraded ground, such as access roads, without approval from the Office of Public Works (OPW).
