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Project Introduction


Kilkenny County Council as the Lead Authority, in partnership with Carlow County Council and The Office of Public Works (OPW) are now advancing with Graiguenamanagh-Tinnahinch Flood Relief Scheme.

The OPW has recommended the development of a Flood Relief Scheme for Graiguenamanagh-Tinnahinch as a result of the work completed in the South Eastern Catchment Flood Risk Assessment and Management (CFRAM) Study.

This Flood Relief Scheme is part of the €1bn National Fund announced by the Government for Flood Relief Schemes throughout the Country in May 2018. Graiguenamanagh-Tinnahinch is on the Kilkenny-Carlow border and Kilkenny County Council are acting as the Lead Authority for the Scheme.

Kilkenny County Council commissioned ByrneLooby in February 2020, to develop and implement a Flood Relief Scheme for Graiguenamanagh-Tinnahinch.





Scheme Area

The Scheme Area is defined above for the Project including the River Barrow, Duiske and tributaries. The Study Area will include any areas that require hydrological or environmental assessment as part of the scheme. This is expected to be at a minimum the Barrow Catchment draining to the Scheme Area.

Consideration will also be given to measures located outside of the scheme area that provide flood mitigation for the outlined area.

Public Engagement Event

The purpose of this event is to introduce the project team, outline the process for delivering the scheme and gather valuable local knowledge from stakeholders and the public. The public information is essential in achieving this project objective and we are seeking any initial views on key issues relating to the scheme or previous flood events.

- Specifying environmental and hydrometric river survey contracts
