



- 15 St. Patrick's Bridge [1789, replaced 1861].
- 16 Wonderford's Bridge [built 1776 and later known as Clarke's Bridge].
- 17 Site of Calvills Quay with drawbridge at entrance [reclaimed to form St. Patrick's street].
- 18 Post Office Quay reclaimed to form the Grand Parade [Tuckey's Bridge no longer depicted].
- 19 Charlotte Quay, Lawton's Quay, and Morrison's Quay now forming 'Morrison's Island'.
- 20 Dunscomb's Marsh reclaimed to form Lapp's Island, adjacent to Cold Harbour Quay.
- 21 Upstream terminus of the New Wall [later known as the Navigation Wall].
- 22 Reclamation of waterway running through Hammond's Marsh [now forming Henry Street].
- 23 River Lee Porter Brewery, later becoming the site of Lee Mills.
- 24 Location of bridge depicted on Rocque's map of 1773, annotated 'Alderman Reilly's Bridge'.
