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- 1. Update on Interim Works
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Interim Works – progress to date (1)

 Significant programme of interim works carried out in 2024; the following items have been completed since our last meeting:

Installation of replacement CCC gauge at Tir Cluain

 In channel vegetation clearance and removal of deposited material from the channel near the Lidl Bridge







Interim Works – progress to date (2)



 OPW hydrometrics team have installed two additional gauges in Midleton (Dungourney and Peoples Park). These are available to view online:

Interim Works – progress to date (3)



Woodlands Estate:

- Temporary defences (sandbags) were installed in November 2024
- Some remedial work to be carried out in coming weeks



 Assessment is ongoing; timeline is likely to be later in 2025 before works delivered at this location (subject to landowner agreements)






Individual Property Protection (1)



- Midleton & East Cork IPP scheme was launched on October 4th and went live for applications on October 7th
- Closing date was extended from 11th to 18th November
- A total of 964 applications have been received
- 530 properties have been assigned to engineering consultants for survey, of these 348 properties have been surveyed, and the surveys of the remaining 182 will commence this week.
- A further 256 properties have been tendered for engineering assessments in the past number of weeks, these surveys are anticipated to commence in the coming weeks.



Individual Property Protection (2)



- A total of 167 applications were deemed not to have met criteria for inclusion in the scheme*
- Of these, 18 were invalid applications:
 - Multiple applications by the same applicant for the same Eircode
 - Dual applications submitted for Council properties by both CCC Housing and the tenant of the property
 - Outside of the Cork County Council administrative area
- The remaining 149 applications have had a second review carried out by CCC. This review has taken into account:
 - o Information submitted with the initial application,
 - o Any additional information emailed to ipp@corkcoco.ie following the initial assessment, and
 - A mapping review to ensure consistency of assessment between neighbouring properties.
- CCC will discuss our review with OPW in the coming weeks.

^{*} The property is predicted to be at risk of flooding in a 1% AEP fluvial event (i.e. a fluvial/river flooding event with a 1% annual exceedance probability, or a 1 in 100 chance of happening in any given year) or 0.5% AEP tidal event (i.e. a tidal flooding event with a 0.5% annual exceedance probability, or a 1 in 200 chance of happening in any given year), or the property flooded internally during Storm Babet. It is important to note that Storm Babet was a much larger event than a 1% AEP fluvial event.

Individual Property Protection (3)




- 2 supply tenders for 250 gates each have been tendered by CCC
 - A supplier has been appointed for the first of these contracts.
 - The tender award process is ongoing for the second contract.
- CCC are also preparing works contracts for the remedial works identified by the engineers
 - We anticipate the first such tender will be issued in February.





- Cork County Council has now filled all OPW funded roles, bringing the total number of OPW funded staff in CCC's flood projects section to nine
- A separate team is also funded by the OPW for the delivery of the IPP scheme



Update on Midleton Flood Relief Scheme Delivery (1)



In the last period:

- Landowner engagement & stakeholder engagement has continued
- Ecological surveys carried out to inform advance works assessments
- Workshops on drainage design, hydrology and groundwater modelling held
- Consultation with LAWPRO and IFI

Arup deliverables in the last period:

- Landscape design package
- Landscape strategy plan

Update on Midleton Flood Relief Scheme Delivery (2)




Over the next period:

- Overwintering bird surveys will continue
- Underwater archaeology surveyor will commence on site
- Individual landowner meetings will be held over the coming months
- Landowner Information Clinic was held on 22/01/2025 (presentation is available on project website)
 - Well-attended (over 100 attendees)
 - Initial step in the landowner engagement process, CCC outlined the engagement process for landowners over the coming months

Advance Works (1)



- Tir Cluain Potential Advance Works; proposed for delivery under a Part 8 planning process (pending environmental screening)
 - Planning design is well advanced
 - Environmental screening is ongoing
 - CCC & Arup will be engaging directly with relevant landowners over the coming weeks, to secure landowner agreements
 - Project team has been engaging with CCC ecologists, planners and archaeologists on the proposed development

- Final details on timeline will be provided following completion of ongoing environmental screening and landowner discussions
- Other locations in Midleton are also being considered for Advance Works (GAA, Carrigogna Bridge), subject to further assessments
