Purpose of the Project

The purpose of the River Dodder Flood Alleviation Scheme Phase 3 is to assess and develop a viable, cost effective and sustainable Flood Alleviation Scheme in order to alleviate flooding along the River Dodder between Clonskeagh Road Bridge to Orwell Road Bridge including Little Dargle Stream at Braemor Road-Woodside Drive south-eastern junction.

Dublin City Council have appointed Byrnelooby to undertake the design and implementation of the proposed River Dodder Flood Alleviation Scheme Phase 3. Dublin City Council will be working together with the Office of Public Works and Dún Laoghaire-Rathdown County Council to deliver the project.

The scheme will be delivered in 5 Stages as shown over.








