PORTARLINGTON FLOOD RELIEF SCHEME

PROJECT NEWS

Stage I - Scheme Development and Design of Portarlington's Flood Relief Scheme (FRS) - is being advanced by Binnies and Nicholas O'Dwyer (B/ NOD), together with Laois County Council (LCC), Offaly County Council (OCC) and the project's Steering Group which consists of members from the Office of Public Works (OPW). Progress is ongoing in terms of development of the scheme design, engineering surveys and environmental assessments.

CURRENT PROGRESS

Since the last newsletter (November 2024), the following has progressed:

The Utility Survey tender was awarded to Precision Utility Mapping. Surveying started in January and was completed on the 14th of February, with affected landowners contacted via letter before the works began. The survey acquires mapped subsurface information using Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) methods. The survey output is currently being reviewed by the Project Team.

Ground Investigations Ireland (GII), the appointed contractor for the site investigations, started the ground investigation work in January with completion of the works expected for mid of April. Affected landowners were contacted via letter before the works began. The investigation will provide details on the soil strata to better understand the subsurface conditions and inform the design.

B/NOD submitted updated design drawings on the 12th of December, following previously received comments. A second technical meeting was held on the 7th of January, where the design updates were discussed. The design drawings and buildability report are now being finalised by B/NOD.

The Options Development report is being finalised and will be completed in the next period, including a detailed Climate Change Adaptation Plan.

The monthly steering group meeting was held in person in February, with representatives from B/NOD and LCC carrying out a joint site walkover to see areas where there have been developments since previous visits and to support the ongoing site investigations.

Coordination with the chapter suppliers for the Environmental Impact Assessment Report (EIAR) is in progress. The preferred suppliers for each chapter have been identified, and several chapters have been started.

A meeting was held with Inland Fisheries Ireland (IFI) on the 27th of February to discuss their comments to the EIA Scoping Report to ensure a successful planning submission in 2025.

NEXT STEPS

Binnies and Nicholas O'Dwyer continue to progress the development of the Scheme.

The Project Team is currently finalising design drawings along with the Buildability report and the Options Development report. The buildability report detail the planned construction methodology and access. The Options Development report outlines the preferred design of the Scheme, shaping the direction of the project moving forward.

Work on the Environmental Impact Assessment Report has commenced for various chapters, but it requires Completion of the Stage I design to progress further. The Natura Impact Statement (NIS), Landscape Visual Assessment (LVIA) and the Appropriate Assessment are scheduled to start soon following the Completion of the Stage I design.

The Project Team is progressing with the Utility Survey and the Site investigations, required to further refine the design.
